**Definitions: Merriam Webster:** criticism for a fault

**Bible Hub:** In the Bible, "reprove" generally means to correct, rebuke, or express disapproval of someone's actions, often with the intention of guiding them towards repentance and improvement. It is rooted in love and concern for the spiritual well-being of others, rather than mere criticism.

**Reproof, Reprove:**

**Refutation:**

1. The act of refuting.
2. Something, such as an argument, that refutes someone or something.
3. The act or process of refuting or disproving, or the state of being refuted; proof of falsehood or error; the overthrowing of an argument, opinion, testimony, doctrine, or theory, by argument or countervailing proof.

**Confute:** to overwhelm in argument : refute conclusively

**Contradict:** An inconsistency or discrepancy
